The S.S. Sagona arrived from Labnoon, via Conception Bay ports. The steamer brought along about twothirds freight and some 300 passengers mostly all of whom were landed at ports of call in Conception Bay. The weather along the Labrador for the last two weeks has been fairly favorable and a good deal of fish has been made ready for market and shipped off the coast. Only a few of the "floaters" are now on the coast and most of the crews have left for home. Fishing is practically over, though cod is still fairly plentiful and those remaining behind until the return of the Seal and Sagona will likely keep at fishing for another week or so.
