London, March 14. The Pall Mall Gazette says that Mr. Disraeli told the Queen yesterday that he was not prepared to form a Cab-inet. The Gazette is confident that under the present circumstances, Mr. Gladstone will be recalled to the head of the Governent. The Globe declares the latter a

London, March 14, 11 p. m.—Mr. Disraeli is still reluctant to assume the task of organizing a new Government. It was positively asserted at Carleton Club this afternoon, that one thing is settled, namely, that if the Conservatives take office that Mr. Disraeli will not be Premier.— That Mr Disraeli will inform the Queen to-morrow that it is impossible for him to form a Ministry, and will suggest that the responsibility be entrusted to the Earl of Derby, who has the support of the old Whigs. In the Reforn Club the belief is that the chances of the return of the Conservatives to power are sinking and that Mr. Gladstone in a few days their seats.

New York, March 15.

A special from London dated vester day says : "A rumor generally prevails in London that Disraeli has refused the Premiership, but it is believed to be incor rect. The facts simply are that Disraeli has respectfully indicated to the Queen the difficulties he would have to confront if he assumed office, even if able to secure the aid of his supporters, considering the Parliamentary position of his components.
