LUCKY FORT WILLIAM

Rich Find of Natural Gas on Mis-

sion Property.
Fort William, May 20.—A strike of natural gas was made here Wednesday, and an investigation is going on to ascertain if it amounts to enough to be commercially important to the city. The strike was made on the Mission property of the G. T. P., near Mission Indian village. were sinking piles for the roundhouse foundation to the bedrock, in some places sixty-four feet below the surace, when one pile tapped the natural gas, the pressure of the gas being enough to lift the pile and muck thirty feet into the air. strike was made late yesterday afternoon. At noon a match was struck to the vent of the first strike, and the gas immediately flamed and is still burning. When the second strike was made a match was applied, and the flame has burned steadily ever since. Citizens are much interested, and it is likely the council will vote an appropriation for a thorough investigation. Oldtimers have always had the opinion that there were natural possibilities in the neighborhood and Magistrate Paling has repeatedly stated that he would like to see pro-
