A Masonic Opening.

The Royal Arch Masonic lodges of

and other places, will be present to as-

sist in the ceremonies. A splendid

A New Parsonage.

A sub-committee of the trustee board

of Dundas Centre Church has been

requested to make a report on the ad-

visability of erecting a new parsonage

to replace the present building east of

the church, but as the committee was

given three months in which to make

the report, nothing definite has yet

been decided. It is generally agreed by

the members of the congregation that

a new parsonage is needed, and in all

probability the committee will recom-

mend that a new building be erected

on the site next to the church, which

will meet the demands of the

young men for social and other gath-

erings. Several members of the com-

mittee when questioned as to this side

of the matter, stated that as yet it had

not been considered.

THREE YEARS FOR

BRUTAL ASSAULT

George Wright Was Given a Long

Term at Chatham.

[Canadian Press.]

Chatham, Jan. 7.—George Wright,

the youthful negro who brutally as-

saulted George (Doc) Dawson, a Chat-

ham Township farmer, on New

Year's Eve, was today sentenced to

three years in Kingston Penitenti-

ary. The prisoner denied that he had

struck Dawson's money, but ad-

mitted striking him over the head

with a brick and then when he fell

to the ground kicking him in the face.

The charge was amended to as-

sault and doing grievous bodily harm,

and the magistrate imposed the most

severe sentence in his power under

this charge.

Wright declared he struck Dawson

because the latter had called him an

obnoxious name. Dawson has been

confined in the hospital until recent-

ly and still suffers from pains in his

head. The cuts on the head and face

will remain for the rest of his life.

UNION PRAYER MEETINGS

HELD IN SOUTH LONDON

Rev. W. H. Harvey, of Askin

St. Church, Spoke in St.

James' Church.

Union prayer meetings, which are

being held by the congregations of four

South London churches this week, are

being largely attended, and are very

successful. The Tuesday night gather-

ing was held in the St. James' Angli-

can Church, and was addressed by Rev.

W. H. Harvey, pastor of Askin Street

Methodist Church. His theme was

"The Universal Church."

The next meeting will be held in the

"church" as having two meanings,

namely, in the catholic sense, and in

the limited sense. The catholic or uni-

versal church originated at the day of

Pentecost, and all local denominations

and creeds were branches of this

church. The minister spoke of the church as

St. Paul saw it in his apostolic days.

The apostle compared the church to a

building with Jesus Christ as the cor-

nerstone, while the whole foundation

was the Bible itself. The superstruc-

ture of the church was the member-

ship, and each stone represents a mem-

ber, who has his part to play in per-

forming the missions of the church and

bearing its responsibilities.

The speaker petitioned his auditors

to become active members of the

church, as the growth of the spiritual

life was dependent on it, and because

God has given us the opportunity of

entering the partnership with Him

towards its upbuilding.

The next meeting will be held in the

Baptist Church on Thursday night,

and will be addressed by Rev. J. G.

Stuart.
