good accomplished. If it prove impossible to ratify the pending treaties, and if the same be not warranted by the necessity to execute others, or to amend the pending treaties so that they can be ratified, then the same end-to-be secured, reciprocity should be met by direct legislation.

Wherever the tariff conditions are such that a needed change cannot with advantage be made by the application of the reciprocity idea, then it can be secured by a lowering of duties on a given product.

In my judgment, the tariff on anthracite should be removed and anthracite be put practically where it now is, nominally on the free list. This would have no effect at all save in a crisis, but it would be of service to the people.

It would be both unwise and unnecessary at this time to attempt to reconstruct our financial system, which has been the growth of a century, but some changes in the monetary system, desirable. The mere outline of any plan sufficiently comprehensive to meet these requirements would transgress the appropriate limits of this communication.

How to secure fair treatment alike for labor and capital, and whether employer or employee, without weakening the position of either, is a problem of the highest importance to solve on lines of sanity and far-sightedness. Both kinds of federation, capitalistic and labor, can do much good, and as a necessary corollary they can do evil. The proposed kind of organization should take the form of opposition to whatever is bad in the present, and not of union or non-union—not to attacks upon corporations as such, nor upon unions as such; but to the most far-reaching benefit of our people, and to be accomplished through both corporations and unions. Each must refrain from arbitrary interference with the rights of the other.

It is earnestly hoped that a secretary of commerce may be created with a seat in the cabinet.

I hope soon to submit to the Senate a report on the treaty with Cuba.

A convention with Great Britain has been concluded which will be at once laid before the Senate for ratification.

The arrangement between the United States and Newfoundland on substantially the lines of the convention formerly negotiated by the secretary of state, Mr. Blaine. Reciprocal trade relations will be greatly to the advantage of both countries.

The International Tribunal which sits at the Hague is an event of good omen from which great benefit will accrue to all nations.

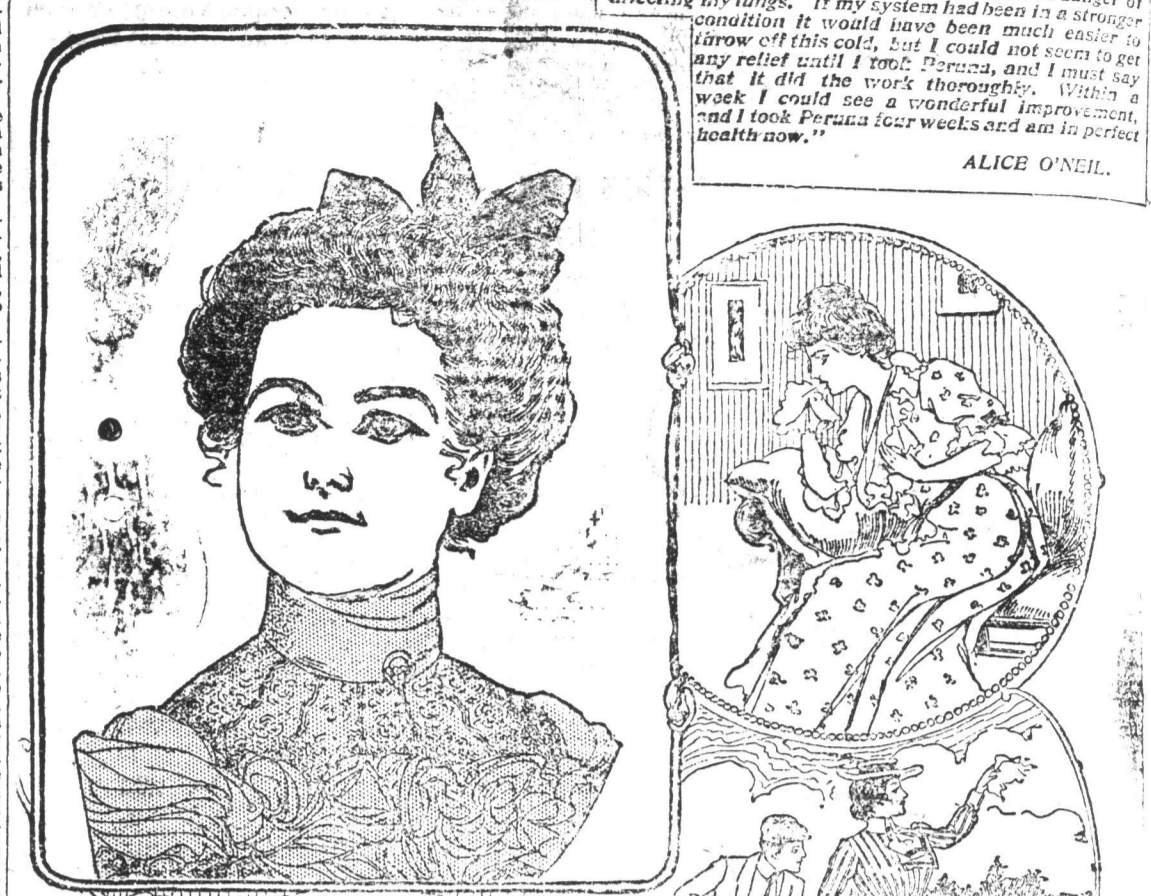
