THE LEAGUE'S MANIFESTO

WHAT THE ENGLISH AND IRISH PRESS SAY ABOUT IT. The "No Rent" Policy. By Addressed to the League—Mr. Egan on the Situation—Victor Hugo Invited to Speak for Ireland—Meetings in the United States.

DUBLIN, Oct. 19.—A land league manifesto says: "Only one constitutional weapon remains in the hands of the league; it is the strongest, swiftest, and most irresistible of all. We hesitate to advise our fellow countrymen to employ it until the savage lawlessness of the English government has provoked a crisis in which we must either consent to see the Irish tenant farmers dispossessed of their organization and land, and so forth."

By an explosion of fire damp at the Cincinnati coal mines, Elizabeth, Pa., last Saturday, Patrick Dunne was killed and three other men were wounded. Many arrests have been made.

REPRODUCTION OF RENT. Longworth O'Brien has inherited the estates in Westmeath county, has deducted the fifth of his rent to his tenants, and promised to reside upon the estates and consider further reductions. The tenants paid their rents readily and cheered the landlord.

THE DIVISION OF THE DUBLIN PRESS. The Freeman's Journal, in reference to the manifesto of the league, says: "We foresee dire confusion, ruin to individuals, and the ruin of his business. However opinions may differ as to the propriety of the league, there can be no difference as to the eloquence and ability in which the case of the league is put forward."

NOT TO PAY RENTS; we believe a better and wiser spirit is springing up. There is shown in many districts an extreme desire to terminate the fruitless controversy. We have no proof that the tenants are actually carrying out otherwise than in a most honest way. Bigger has started for England to confer with Healy.

THE LEAGUE'S MANIFESTO TO THE ENGLISH PRESS. The London Times says: "It would be unwise to take the league's manifesto too severely or too literally. Irishmen habitually say a good deal more than they mean. There is a suspicious hollowiness in its ring of defiance and a consciousness of real defeat in the very anxiety of its recklessness and impracticable counsel."

THE SIGNATURES TO THE LEAGUE MANIFESTO were not actually written by the printers, but appended by their authority. The second battalion of Grenadier Guards stationed at Windsor, has been ordered to be sent to proceed to Ireland.
