McIntyre & Wardwell (John J. Dixon) received the following despatch today from Schwartz, Dupont & Co., Chicago.

What was a very irregular market, the market was not very active. The trade was not very large but fluctuations were of moderate importance.

The best prices were made about noon on the continued damage reports from the Northwest. The low price of the day, however, followed, caused by the liquidation of a large long line, which has been carried here for about a week, then the close was almost at the top again.

The violence of these fluctuations was due to the narrowness of the speculation. It took very little news or very little trade to have an unusual effect on prices. There was a decrease in the prices of wheat of a few cents, but helped toward one of the rallies. There was a moderate cash demand over 100 bushels. Opening called some advance. Scattered orders were small. Receipts at the winter wheat points were under last year's, about half as many as St. Louis. Detroit reported only three cars of new wheat and no other wheat was reported from the country. The car lots of new wheat were a little over last year's. The grading was not so near as good. Crop reports from the Northwest continue about the same. The secretary of Milwaukee Chamber of Commerce, a good authority, estimates the total crop of wheat and corn at 150,000,000 bushels.
