Hens Lay Most the First Year.

Up to what age should hens be kept for egg-production? To answer this question, sixty white leghorn pullets that had made a high record the first year were selected by the Maryland experimental station from a flock of two hundred and forty, and complete returns are given for three years, the most important data being as follows:

Table with columns: Eggs laid, Average per hen, Total profits, Profit per hen. Rows: Year 1, Year 2, Year 3.

Of the eighty fowls, 83.3 per cent. laid the maximum number of eggs the first year and only 16.7 per cent. gave the greatest production the second year, it did not compare favorably with that of the other two years and was too small to justify the labor and expense of maintaining them.

Shareholders Must Pay Double Liability.

Toronto, Oct. 10.—Farmers Bank shareholders will be required under the Bank Act to pay the double liability which they have been dreading. An order has been issued by George Kappel, official referee, calling upon all shareholders of the wrecked bank to pay "the amount unpaid upon their shares, the amount of all dividends wrongfully paid to them by the Farmers Bank and 100 per cent. of the amount due them by the shareholders under the provision of section 125 of the Bank Act."

The order will be stubbornly contested by many of the shareholders, several of whom are men of but moderate means and who will be ruined if compelled to pay double the amount of the face value of the stock for which they subscribed. The general defense is that the organizers of the concern never complied with the Bank Act and the certificate was not legally issued.
