By the building on to a root or stem word of affixes and prefixes, it is curious by the meaning of a word may be extended. Thus mudwasuggeshin, "it is heard ling on the floor"; mudwa means "sound," sug means "a board or floor," and shin an applies "falling."

On the whole there need be no very great difficulty in acquiring a knowledge of the Ojebway language. The pronunciation is comparatively easy; the words are belief in the plainest manner possible, and though indeed many of them are exceedingly long, yet may they all be correctly pronounced, after a little practice, by a serving the accented syllables. The main difficulty, it will be found, lies in the the flection of the verb and in the inseparable particles.
