

He died the following year. The daughter, Eliza, married a Mr. King, and had one son who inherited his uncle's property and took the name Edwards, hyphenated with his father's name, King. I visited this second cousin, William King-Edwards, in 1901 and was hospitably entertained by him and his interesting family at Dartans House, Castlederg, about 12 miles from Londonderry.

My grandmother on the maternal side was a Graham, and my mother was an Armstrong. Both these numerous families were descendants of families who had migrated from Scotland in the 17th century, or at an earlier date. The families have now representatives, not only in the British Isles, but all over the world.
