HOW TO REMIT.

POSTAGE IS EXTRA. Remittances should be made by Postal Note, Post Office or Express Money Order, or Bank Notes at current rates of exchange.

Current stamps of Great Britain may be used in making small remittances. United States bank notes, silver and stamps (values up to 10c.) are accepted at face to any amount.

Canadian correspondents will find postal notes convenient for small remittances, but where these cannot be readily obtained, 5c. and 1c. stamps will be accepted.

Correspondents in other British Colonies until further notice may remit in stamps to any amount. Sets (up to 3p., 6p. or 1s.) & new or provisional issues are preferred.

From correspondents in Afghanistan, Bulgaria, China, Corea, Creta, Egypt, Greece, Indian Native States, Japan, Montenegro, Persia, Roumania, Servia, Siam, Tunis and Turkey, we will accept current unused stamps up to \$2.00, if in sets of at least five values and well centred.
