A committee was appointed to collect subscriptions for the Dutch Ambulance Fund. Mr. Karel Boissevain, Consul-General of Holland, has consented to act as honorary treasurer, and subscriptions sent to him will be duly acknowledged and transmitted to the central committee of the Red Cross Society, at Amsterdam. "Bis dat qui cito dat." The hospital ship Konig, with a complete staff of surgeons, nurses and equipment left Amsterdam for Lorenzo Marquez on November 4. Hospital supplies will be sent fortnightly to Delagoa Bay with the steamer of the Deutsche Ost African Linie.
