After due publicity in the Herald, also by Handbills, as well as by full descriptive Catalogue, the Stock imported by the Society was sold to-day at auction, by Messrs. Wm. Law, & Co., on the Parade Ground, at prices as across. No pains had been spared in any respect, to make the sale a successful one, the animals considering their long journey, during which, regular feeding was often impracticable, were in a fair condition, certainly looking better than the average of country Stock; there was no reason to doubt the purity of their blood, or that they were well bred. Each bore strongly the distinctive marks of its breed. The only restriction upon an open sale (and permission ever was accorded to qualify by joining the Society subsequently) was that the purchaser should be a member of the County Society, and should give bonds in double the amount paid to keep the animal for breeding purposes for three years.

The prices brought, indicate how little has yet been learned by our farmers as to the value of pure blood, and was felt by the Secretary to be a most discreditable reflection upon his labors, and a disgrace to the County.

About twenty-five head, besides the imported Stock, were offered, but were mostly bid in by the owners, there seeming to be no disposition to pay anything like value.
