The steamers Carolina, Canada, and Saguenay will perform the service between Quebec and the Saguenay, and will run as follows: From this date until June 15th, steamers will leave Quebec for the Saguenay and intermediate ports on Tuesdays and Fridays at 7.30 a.m., and from June 15th to July 15th, on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays at 7.30 a.m., and from July 15th until further notice, daily (Sundays excepted), at 7.30 a.m.

Steamers leave Chicoutimi the day following their departure from Quebec at 9.30 a.m. A first-class orchestra will be on board these steamers during June, July, and August. All the above steamers are lighted throughout by electricity, and no expense is spared to insure comfort and convenience to the travelling public.
