- (3) Where the ship is at or near such port, the registrar or chief officer of customs at the port shall, on demand of a majority of the owners thereof, require the master or any other person in possession of the certificate of registry to produce and deliver the certificate to him; and if the certificate is not forthwith produced and delivered up to him, he may detain the ship, and not allow it to proceed to sea until the certificate has been produced and delivered up to him."
- (3) All that portion of section 32 preceding paragraph (a) thereof is repealed and the following substituted therefor:
 - "32. Every registrar and the chief officer of customs at every port shall keep a record of every endorsement of a change of master made by him on the certificate of registry of a ship, and shall specify in the record"
- (4) Section 33 is repealed and the following substituted therefor:

Record in office of registrar, etc.

- "33. Every such record shall be kept in the office of the registrar or officer of customs making the record, or his successor as such, and shall, at all times during the usual office hours, be open to all persons for inspection, without fee or reward."
