Petitions

Mr. Nelson A. Riis (Kamloops—Shuswap): Mr. Speaker, it is my honour to present a petition on behalf of a large number of Canadians who are concerned that the Government of Canada has imposed a retaliatory tariff on imported books. This has limited the access of Canadians to literature and information of all sorts particularly, as the previous speaker has indicated, during this time of year when people are purchasing more books than they would during the rest of the year. This penalizes Canadian consumers, book publishers, booksellers and distributors and Canada's culture, and the petitioners call upon Parliament to urge the Government to rescind this tariff which threatens irreparable harm to the Canadian book industry and compromises federal policy on the cultural industry with respect to free trade negotiations.

OPPOSITION TO PROPOSED CHANGES TO PATENT ACT

Mr. Nelson A. Riis (Kamloops—Shuswap): I have another petition which draws to the attention of the House the Government's intention to change the Patent Act relating to prescription drugs. I think by all accounts it is accepted, except by the Minister of Consumer and Corporate Affairs (Mr. Andre), that this will result in increased drug prices for Canadian consumers. In fact, I believe even the Minister of Consumer and Corporate Affairs recently indicated that it will. This will severely restrict the ability of average Canadians to buy the necessary prescription drugs. The petitioners call upon Parliament to reject this legislation and urge the Government to reconsider its introduction.

Mr. Nelson A. Riis (Kamloops—Shuswap): It is my pleasure to move, seconded by the Hon. Member for Churchill (Mr. Murphy):
