

5. *Resolved*,—That the salary of the County Court Judge of the Eastern Judicial District of Manitoba shall be \$2,000 per annum for his first three years of service, and \$2,400 per annum after such three years service, and that he shall be paid such travelling allowance as the Governor in Council may from time to time determine.

6. *Resolved*,—That the salaries and allowances shall be paid out of any unappropriated moneys forming part of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Canada.

7. *Resolved*,—That from and after the first day of July, in the year 1884, no travelling or circuit allowances shall be paid to the Judges of the Court of Appeal for Ontario.

Resolutions to be reported.

The said Resolutions were accordingly reported, read a second time, and agreed to.

Sir *John A. Macdonald* then introduced a Bill No. 134 to provide for the salaries and superannuation and travelling allowances of certain Judges of certain Provincial Courts; which was read the first time, and ordered for a second reading, *on Monday, next*.

A Message was received from the Senate, with the two following Bills of their own, to which the concurrence of this House was desired, *viz.* :—

Bill No. 135 intituled: "An Act relating to Bills of Exchange and Promissory Notes in the Province of Prince Edward Island;"—and

Bill No. 136 intituled: "An Act to amend the Law respecting Lotteries."

On motion of Sir *John A. Macdonald*, the said Bills were severally read the first time, and ordered for a second reading, *on Monday next*.

Sir *Charles Tupper* laid before The House,—Proposed grant of further subsidy at the rate of \$6,000 per mile, or a further sum in all of \$660,000, from Gravenhurst to Callander, 110 miles, to such Company as shall be approved by the Governor in Council,—and also two letters having reference to the subject.

The Resolutions adopted in Committee of Supply *on Wednesday, the 16th instant*, were reported, read a second time, and concurred in, and are as follows:—
