LACROSSE AT COAST PRACTICALLY DEAD

Supporters of Pro Game Have Lost Interest in the Far West.

NEW WESTMINSTER, Sept. 16.—With the Minto Cup games between the V.A.C. of Vancouver and the Salmon Belles, the lacrosse season at the coast is practically dead.
