Report of Committee Re Canada Temperance Act.

Your Committee had under their consideration a communication from R. Smith, Esq., Barrister, asking that this Council refund to certain claimants moneys paid into the County Treasury by William Bow, Police Magistrate of the County of Dundas, for fines alleged to have been improperly imposed for violation of the second part of the Canada Temperance Act. We also took communication of two judgments obtained against this Corporation for the recovery of fines imposed by the said William Bow *in re* Canada Temperance Act. Your Committee also had under their consideration a communication from Henry Totten, of the Provincial Secretary's Department, dated 11th October, instant, in reference to the payment into the County Treasury of the balance of appropriation made by this Council for the enforcement of the Canada Temperance Act remaining to the credit of the License Fund special (Scott Act) account.

With reference to the last mentioned communication, your Committee recommend that the Treasurer be authorized to make the arrangements therein required with the Government, in order to have the said balances paid into the County Treasury; also that the Treasurer be requested to notify the License Inspectors, who have not already sent in their accounts, to do so immediately, in order that the balance may be paid into the County Treasury as soon as possible. As to the communication from Mr R. Smith, Barrister, your Committee recommend that action in the matter therein referred to be deferred until the January session of this Council, as the counsel for said claimants, Mr. Griffith, has consented to have the matter lay over to January next.
