Receive a Warmer Greeting Than in Any City of Their Native Country.

Paris, Dec. 5.-King Albert and Queen Elizabeth of Belgium and their eldest son were given an enthusiastic welcome when they arrived in Par.s

The royal train, decorated with Belgian and allied escutcheons and flags, reached the Bois de Boulogne station at 2 o'clock this afternoon. The streets were crowded along the entire

route from the station,
King Albert wore the khaki uniform of a Belg an general, Prince Leopold a private's uniform, and Queen Elizaa privates uniform, and Queen Elizabeth a tan-colored coat, with a grey fur collar and a tan toque. The Queen sat beside Madame Poincare in an open carriage and smiled happily as wonen and children in the throng thiew flowers into the carriage.

The royal pair have entered many reconquered cities in their own king-dom lately—Bruges, Ghent, Brussels and Liege, which have been freed from the German yoke—but it was left for Paris, unsullied by German occupation, to give the monarchs and the crown orince a greater reception as far as numbers were concerned. Larger creds greeted them here than in the Belgian capital. In the drive thru the city, King Albert was seated beside President Poincare, Queen Elizabeth rode with the wife of the president, and Prince Leopold was accompanied by Premier Clemenceau. All along the route the royal party was accorded an enthusiastic reception. M. Clemenceau and Prince Leopold, chatting pleasantly,

and Prince Leopold, chatting pleasantly, attracted nearly as much attention as the president and the king.

At the gates of the Quay D'Orsay, Belgian soldiers of the 6th Division were awaiting to be presented to their king.
