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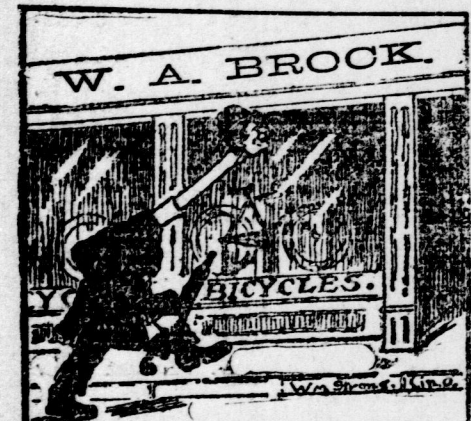

METEOROLOGICAL

Toronto, April 30, 8 p.m.—A depression of considerable importance has developed today over the Western States with great rapidity, and it will now probably move into the lake region. The weather here has been very warm from the lower lakes to the Atlantic, attended by a few scattered thunderstorms, and cool from Lake Superior to the British Columbia coast. Snow is falling tonight over Alberta. Minimum and maximum temperatures: Victoria, 34-52; Calgary, 22-24; Qu'Appelle, 32-60; Winnipeg, 28-56; Port Arthur, 32-48; Parry Sound, 54-80; Toronto, 50-79; Ottawa, 54-84; Montreal, 58-82; Quebec, 46-80; Halifax, 35-76.

Local temperature—The highest and lowest reading of the thermometer at the observatory on Saturday, April 29, were 82 and 51 above; on Sunday, April 30, 82 and 60 above.

Sun rises today, 5:10; sets 7:20. Moon rises 12:32 a.m.; sets 10:17 a.m.

A LOCAL BUDGET

PUBLIC RECEPTION

To Be Given Rev. Prof. Jordan, D.D., in Strathtroy.

THE CITY CHURCHES

Annual Exchange of Pulpits Was Not Largely Observed.

The pulpit exchanges arranged for yesterday morning were not carried out in a number of cases, for various reasons.

First Presbyterian Church, London, was occupied yesterday by Rev. John Clark, B.A., of Toronto, in exchange with his brother, Mr. Clark's evening sermon dealt with the text and thought that Jesus Christ came not to destroy, but to fulfill, the law. The preacher referred, among other things, to the thought of some, especially the young, that the law and the flesh of life would be lessened by following Christ. This was completely wrong. Jesus Christ came not to destroy fullness of life, fullness of joy, but to make life wide and deep, full and rich.

At Adelaide Street Baptist Church, Rev. J. J. Ford, preached from II. Chronicles, xxv, at three o'clock, the subject of "Conversion," taking as his text Christ's call to Matthew, "Follow me," as found in Matthew ix, 9. The preacher contended strongly that "the first-life is the ideal life," the true Christ being the highest type of manhood.

Rev. Dr. Robert Johnston occupied the pulpit of the Talbot Street Baptist Church yesterday morning. He spoke from Daniel iii, 14, 15, 16: "The Non-conformists of Babylon."

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At Empress Avenue Methodist Church Rev. A. G. Harris preached from Luke xii, 43, yesterday morning. Mr. Harris told how Christ bore a cruel and painful cross in silence, but when the thief feebly asked if Christ would only remember him, Christ immediately answered: "This day shalt thou be with me in paradise." In closing, Mr. Harris asked and answered, "What is paradise?" He said he did not wish to be misunderstood. He believed paradise to be the place where the souls of the righteous went to enjoy themselves until the resurrection, when they should go to heaven. Some people believe that the soul sleeps with the body, others believe that the soul hovers above the body. That is a wrong idea. The soul immediately goes to the Father.

A SERMON IN SONG.
A unique and impressive service was given at the First Methodist Church last evening. The sermon, entitled "Penitence, Pardon and Peace," was delivered in song by the choir, the scripture lessons being read by the pastor, and the rendition of J. H. Maunders' musical production was very artistic. The soloists were: Miss Inez E. Smith, soprano; Miss Myra Pickard, contralto; Mr. C. E. Cunningham, tenor; Mr. H. R. McDonald, baritone.

CONFIRMATION.
His lordship the Bishop of Huron, assisted by Ven. Archdeacon Davis, held confirmation service at St. James' Episcopal Church, South London, last evening. About 35 young people were confirmed, including a class from St.

George's Church, West London. The service was most impressive, and the bishop's remarks were listened to with the closest attention. There was special music by the choir.

A PRELATE'S FAREWELL

Marvellous Results Accomplished by Bishop O'Connor in London

Congregation of St. Peter's Do Honor to the Retiring Bishop—Glowing Tribute and a Presentation.

Rt. Rev. Denis O'Connor, archbishop-elect of Toronto, and for nine years bishop of London, said farewell to his congregation at St. Peter's Cathedral yesterday morning. In the course of his address he gave a somewhat detailed statement of the affairs of the church and the diocese during his administration. This statement included the astonishing information that since 1911 the church debt had been reduced from \$64,200 to \$27,000, which would be diminished by yet another \$1,000 on receipt of the bequest of Walsh.
