RAILWAY AWARD TO BENEFIT 200,000 ON CANADIAN SYSTEMS

Further Increase in Freight Rates Expected As Result.

WINNIPEG, July 20.—Two hundred thousand railway workers in Canada will benefit to the same extent as United States railway employees by the award announced in Chicago today, it was estimated by one of the highest railway officials in Winnipeg. The award will mean increases in wages aggregating \$70,000,000 in Canada he said.

FAIR SEX ASPIRE AT PRIVY COUNCIL

Their Freedom League Calls On King To Let Them in and Wants Full Equality With

Men.

London, July 26. — British women are becoming more and more self-reliant, not to say independent. At a recent meeting of the Women's Freedom League it was decided to petition the King, "through his responsible ministers," to appoint women to the privy council.

Many Canadians may not know that this body dates back to ancient Norman times. Nowadays, although the true privy council is the cabinet, the name is given collectively to a large number (309 on the latest list) of eminent people whose membership and position are titular only. The title of the council is the "Lords and Others of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council." The members are addressed as "Right Honorables." Perhaps some of the ladies of the Women's Freedom League would like to see that title before their names as rightly indicating their admirable character.

At this same meeting the women demanded that all barriers of inequality between the sexes be broken down. The women called on the Government to bring in a bill granting the franchise to women on equal terms with men. Pensions for widows with children under 16 years were also demanded.

The same spirit is shown by women in every walk of life. At a meeting of the Women's Labor Parliament the other day Miss Adams of Glasgow, a housing reformer, exclaimed:

"I want a home, a house, not a washhouse. I don't want a washday. I think my laundry should be done by machinery in a municipal laundry. It should be taken away in a motor and brought back to me all beautiful, clean and finished. No washhouse, no washday, for me."

The Parliament has called on the Government, in view of the hindrance to marriage and the impossibility of finding adequate accommodation for family life, to institute an inquiry into prices of building materials; to raise a national loan for housing; to consult working women in regard to plans, and in the event of the house famine not being quickly dealt with, to introduce a room rationing scheme as a temporary expedient.




