1. The land is sold in sections of 36 acres each.

2. The land is sold to the highest bidder.

3. The land is sold for cash.

4. The land is sold for a term of years.

5. The land is sold for a life estate.

6. The land is sold for a fee simple.

7. The land is sold for a leasehold.

8. The land is sold for a joint tenancy.

9. The land is sold for a tenancy in common.

10. The land is sold for a trust.

11. The land is sold for a mortgage.

12. The land is sold for a charge.

13. The land is sold for a lien.

14. The land is sold for a right of way.

15. The land is sold for a right of easement.

16. The land is sold for a right of pre-emption.

17. The land is sold for a right of redemption.

18. The land is sold for a right of purchase.

19. The land is sold for a right of sale.

20. The land is sold for a right of entry.

21. The land is sold for a right of reverter.

22. The land is sold for a right of re-vestment.

RECEIPTS LIGHT AT THE WHOLESALES

Little Demand for Home Grown and Imported Fruits and Vegetables.

FOTATOES WERE FIRM

Now Selling at Three Dollars and Fifty Cents Per Two Bushels.

Receipts of both home-grown and imported fruits and vegetables were very light on Friday. Potatoes were firm, selling at \$3.40 to \$3.50 per 100 lbs. (two bushels). Peaches were quite firm, now selling at \$4.40 to \$4.50 per 100 lbs. (two bushels). Apples were firm in quality and price, selling at from 10c to 20c per dozen.

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
