THE Book Department is a busy place these days. Here you will and all sorts and conditions of men and women drifting towards sections that are marked "History," "Fiction." "War Books," etc. Near the centre of the great Department is a square library table, whose upright centreplece is a brave Canadian flag. And all day long this table is besieged by interested folk, for it is plainly marked "Canadian Books." One can hardly imagine a more interesting collection than this of work by our own writers, covering so wide a range of thought and material that by merely reading the titles the observer must realize that no longer can the charge be laid against us of marrow vision or provincialism.

To mention only a few of these

To mention only a few of these Canadian books, there are among the novels: "The Major," by Ralph Connor; that charming story, "Up the Hill and Over," by Isabel Ecclestone MacKay; "Anne's House of Dreams," by L. M. Montgomery; "The Inner Door," a story of Capital and 'Labor, by Aian Sullivan, and "More Letters From Billy," that delightful Canadian soid.er. These have recently been published, but we find also such an old favorite as the first Canadian historic novel, which was written by Major John Richardson and published in London, England, nearly one hundred years ago. It is called "Waccousta," and appears in a new dress with fine illustrations by C. W. Jeffreys. There are also "Secret Trails," by Charles G. D. Roberts; "Wild Animal Ways," by Ernest Thompson-Seton; "The Wandering Dog," by Marshall Saunders; a reprint of "Old Man Savarin Stories," by E. W. Thompson—all classics in their way—and a good holiday edition at 60c of the popular novels of the Rev. R. E. Knowles.

In poetry we shall all welcome the latest book by Robert Norwood. "The Piper and the Reed," in which music and color abound, "and Heart of the Hills," by Albert Durrant Watson, with its bigthoughted message. In a heroic little volume, called "A Canadian Twilight," by Bernard Freeman Trotter, are verses which show the touch of the true poet, written by a young soldier who gave his life at the Somme last May. He has been compared with Rupert Brooke and Allan Seegar. There are the ever-popular "Rhymes of a Red Cross Man," by Robert W. Service (of which the illustrated edition is now obtainable at \$2.00), and "Kitchener," that poem by Robert J. C. Stead, which sent its author's name around the world, giving title to a volume of his poems. These are only a few of the Canadian gifts in verse and in fiction which you may choose from this flag-decked library table.
