MOSCOW SPENDS QUIET DAY STRIKE WILL WEAR DOWN But Manufacturers Will Not Be Satisfied Until Sunday Has Gone By.

Moscow, Jan. 27.—The day passed off quietly. It is now almost certain that the strike movement in Moscow and its immediate vicinity will wear itself out within a few days. The printers returned to work this afternoon and a couple more factories south of the river have reopened, but it is suspected that the men are trying to evade the law unless their wages to-morrow they may again strike.

Had a Rough Passage. Halifax, N.S., Jan. 27.—A St. John's N.S. dispatch says the Furness line gunboat City, 14 days out from Liverpool for St. John's, has arrived after a tempestuous passage, with her cargo and crew in good health. She will require repairs, especially in the engine room. Her captain reports a tremendous heavy swell for 120 miles off St. John's with three large bergs—a remarkable fact so early in the season and in view of the great melting ice in the shipping routes.

Latest Rumor is That the H. G. & B. Was Purchased by Mackenzie & Mann and Not by G.T.R.

Hamilton, Jan. 27.—(Special.)—The annual meeting of the H. G. & B. Railway Co. was postponed last Monday. The reason given for the postponement is that the company and the Niagara, St. Catharines & Toronto Railway Co., recently acquired by Mackenzie & Mann, are negotiating with a view to making connections at a point half way between the H. G. & B. terminus, Vineland and St. Catharines. The H. G. & B. has been trying for some years to extend its line to St. Catharines, but the cost of bridging the canal and several difficulties stood in the way of the extension, and the City of St. Catharines declined to purchase the company's stock. The latest rumor is that the H. G. & B. was not bought by the G.T.R., as reported, but by the Mackenzie & Mann, who have acquired the Niagara, St. Catharines & Toronto Railway.

The Toronto & Hamilton Railway Company, which at first said it would be content with a strip of 25 feet in addition to the G.T.R. right-of-way, now says it wants 40 feet. That means that all the sheds and cottages on the side of the Beach will have to go. E. Seagram and other capitalists are in the city arranging to start a brewery independent of the syndicate.
