JEW TOOK FIRST WORLD CENSUS

Remarkable Thirteen Years Journey From Spain in Twelfth Century

Until the twelfth century no great exploration had been made by European adventurers except for one of three reasons—conquest, commerce or religion. But in 1160 a man, Benjamin of Tudela, a Spanish Jew, began a tour which continued thirteen years and covered all of the known, and many of the unknown parts of the world for the purpose of taking a census of his race. The result of his travels was, as far as is known, the first world-wide census of any kind based on authentic information.

Benjamin was the son of the rabbi of Tudela, a town in Navarre. Little was known about him, except in a general way he was supposed to be a bookish and passionately devoted to furthering the interests of his own race. In no way was he particularly fitted to become an explorer and traveler, an exceedingly hazardous occupation in those days.

A desire to know all the places around the world where Jews had migrated led Benjamin to set out on his journey. He left Barcelona and followed the northern shores of the Mediterranean Sea to Rome, where he had an audience with Pope Alexander III. He found little interest in him on that trip. In Naples he counted 500 Jews, and his diary says they "were both industrious and of intelligence passing."

Now he determined to visit Asia and Africa, where the Naples Jews informed him many of their race lived. Accordingly he had charts prepared by Leonardo, a great mapmaker, and set forth. He mentioned the town of Greece, where, he wrote in his diary, some 2,000 Jews controlled the silk and purple industries. He traveled throughout the Balkan Peninsula, a dangerous undertaking, and reached Constantinople. Emperor Constantine, however, was not so friendly to the Jews as the emperor's throne impressed him.

"The golden throne studded with precious stones, above which a golden crown is suspended by a chain of the same precious metal, which rests upon the monarch's head as he sits upon the throne; so brilliant are the jewels in the crown that at night there is no occasion for any further light than that thrown from the brilliant stars of the crown."

He expresses regrets that no Jews were merchants there, and takes up his narrative of Galesa, a shadow of the 2,500 of the sect (Rabinites and Caraites), and among them many rich.
