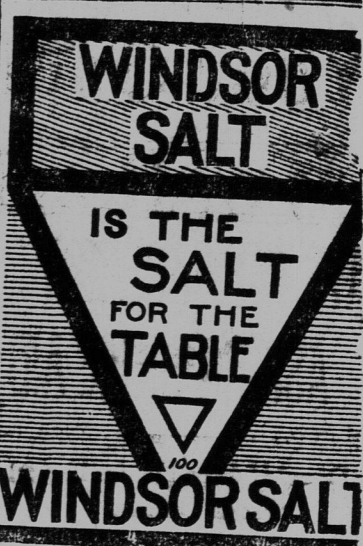
Daily Hints For the Cook

Gingerbread
One-half cup lard, one cup molasses, half teaspoon ginger, quarter teaspoon clove, one cup of sweet milk with one heaping teaspoon soda, one and a half cups sifted flour and a little salt.

Soft Gingerbread
Take one cup of molasses and stir into it flour enough to make a stiff dough. Add two tablespoons of soda in one cup boiling water and turn upon the above. Dissolve one teaspoon of butter or lard. Add a dash of ginger and mix very thoroughly. It is always moist as long as it lasts.

Grandma's Patty Cakes
Two cups sugar, one cup butter or lard (sometimes mix with beef drippings), one tablespoonful soda in one cup sour milk. Mix well, then add half tablespoon lemon extract, flour enough

to make light dough. Bake in you pans. If cookies are preferred use no flour, to roll out well.
