GENEVA, Aug. 14—With the meeting of the seventh annual assembly of the League of Nations on September 6, the League will begin the most mportant and the most critical period of its existence.

In addition to an unusually full agenda of international questions and agenda of international questions and problems, embracing everything from disarmament to white slave traffic, the League will have the two most vital internal problems to settle that it has yet faced. These are the admission of Germany, and the reorganization of the council, which carries with it Brazil's resignation from the League and Spain's threat to do likewise. It is only when the September assembly will have been able to overcome successfully this internal crisis that it will be able to take up the agenda of outside, international questions.






