

Jommy Casimir, sworn, stated that he is an Indian residing on the Kamloops Indian Reserve, County of Yale, Province of British Columbia, That on Saturday, March 15th, 1941, he saw the accused with Paul Basil Paul going west past Lloyd's Garage, towards Chinatown. That this was between 7:30 P.M. and 8:30 P.M.

William Andrew, sworn, stated that he is an Indian residing on Kamloops Indian Reserve, County of Yale, Province of British Columbia. That on Saturday, March 15th, 1941, between 7:30 and 8:00 P.M. while he was getting gas for his car at Lloyd's Garage on Victoria Street, in the City of Kamloops, he saw the accused and Paul Basil Paul heading towards Chinatown. That he spoke to Paul Basil Paul and he spoke to him.

5. This was all the evidence for the Prosecution, and the Magistrate remanded the case until April 9, 1941.

6. On Wednesday, April 9th, 1941, the case was again brought before the Court. The Magistrate read the statements of the Crown Witnesses to Mr. McIntyre and he in turn told the Court he was ready to proceed with the Defence Witnesses.

Witnesses for the Defence.

Mary Ann Bennett, sworn, stated that she resides at 710 Front St. in the City of Kamloops, County of Yale, Province of British Columbia. That she did not see Paul Basil Paul on Saturday, March 15, 1941. That she was home until 7:30 P.M. on date in question with her two daughters, and at that time she walked up town with them as they were going to the show. That she left them at about 8:10 P.M. on the corner of Victoria St., and 3rd avenue and went straight home. That she is well acquainted with Paul Basil Paul. That she did not go into Chinatown at all that day.

Margaret Bennett, sworn, stated that she resides with her mother at 710 Front Street in the City of Kamloops, County of Yale, Prov. British Columbia. That she was home with her mother all afternoon until 7:30 P.M., then they left for town. That she left her mother at about 8:10 P.M. That her mother was heading in the direction of home.

Elsie Dillon, sworn, stated that she resides with her mother at 710 Front Street, City of Kamloops. Corroborated the evidence of previous witness, Margaret Bennett.

Tom Driscoll, sworn, stated that he resides at 154 Seymour Street, west, in the City of Kamloops, County of Yale Province of British Columbia. That he did not see the accused on date in question. That the accused was not down to his place at all that day.

7. The Defence and Prosecution summed up the circumstances of the case, and the Magistrate, after deliberation found the accused GUILTY and fined her \$100.00 or 1/3 months in gaol.

8. As the accused was unable to pay her fine, she is being escorted to Oakalla Prison Farm this date by Mrs. R. Dims, Matron, to serve her sentence.
