EGGS HAVE GONE SLIGHTLY LOWER

Comox Butter Now One of the Standard Qualities.

No news is usually good news in the local market. The absence of fluctuations indicates that not only the markets are stable, but all the conditions which govern them.

This week there have been few changes. The frosts of last week have helped to retard the too early development of the spring goods and have had a healthy toning effect.

Eggs have gone slightly lower and are now retailing at 35 cents a dozen, and in butter the only change is that Comox butter is now brought up to the same price as the nearer home creameries. This indicates that the quality of that butter has improved to the extent of inspiring confidence in the buyer in the product.

Creameries often make the mistake of mixing packed butter with the fresh-made at the time when the price is at its highest. Everyone who knows anything at all about butter knows that they are being defrauded, and the creameries that do it are taboos.
