TERRIBLE SCENES AT CHICAGO FIRE

THIRTEEN PERSONS LOST THEIR LIVES

THOSE WHO WERE NOT SUFFOCATED WERE KILLED BY LEAPING FROM WINDOWS OF PRIVATE HOSPITAL.

Chicago, June 9.—Twelve men and one woman were killed and about 50 persons were injured in a fire which today destroyed the sanitarium conducted by the St. Luke's society, at the corner of Wabash avenue and 21st street. By far the greater portion of the patients received in the institution were those seeking cure from the drink habit, and those who had been addicted to the use of drugs. When the fire broke out there was on the fifth floor a number of patients suffering from delirium tremens, and some who were deranged by drugs. Several of these were strapped to their beds, and it was found impossible to save them, so many did the fire spread through the building.
