and clarity of his vision and the cour-  
ageous persistence which he displayed  
in fighting for Confederation. Sir John  
Macdonald said that he was held in a  
lion, and but for him Confederation  
would never have been carried.  
Carlier was associated with Pappan-  
in the troubles of 1837 and for a  
time was exiled from the country. On  
his return he discharged some bitter-  
ness towards the rebel leader's course  
and became a vigorous supporter of  
British connection. As a French-  
Canadian, Macdonald's maintenance  
of the old traditions, he realized that  
the British flag was the only defence  
of his race. He steadily resisted the  
movement towards annexation to the  
United States, having a pronounced  
distaste for radical or republican ten-  
dencies, and believing, rightly, that  
Quebec would lose its individuality if  
included in the Republic.  
Sir George had no lack of enemies.  
His political opponents attacked him  
from every angle, but he could not be  
or he was persuaded or coerced. His  
course was laid and he held to it. Lack-  
ing an alluring personality, such as  
distinguished Menier and Laurier, he  
plodded resolutely through the politi-  
cal underbrush, not without aerism.  
He lived to see his popularity depart,  
and to be a lonely as well as a weary  
Titan. He and Macdonald are dead,  
but their work lives. Canadians who  
have grown to manhood and grey hairs  
under Confederation know the incom-  
parable value of that measure.  
It gave power and purpose to British  
North America and has been a source  
of strength to the Motherland not a  
time of bitter trial. English and  
French-Canadians alike can pay re-  
spectful tribute to the memory of Sir  
George Edouard Carlier.

**BROADWAY CROWDS ARE AGAIN HAPPY**  
Many of Play Houses Which  
Have Been Closed for Last  
Month Reopen.

New York, Sept. 7.—New York's  
"Great White War" blazed forth to-  
night after the partial eclipse caused  
by the actors' strike. The problem of  
being all dressed up and nowhere to  
go was solved for thousands of num-  
ber of houses which had been forced  
to close during the thirty day war  
between the Theatians and managers  
which ended this morning. Many of  
the closed theatres were unable to  
arrange for a re-opening tonight, but  
all announced that performances will  
be resumed early next week.

According to the claims of the va-  
rious parties to the war it ended in a  
victory for everyone. The Actors  
Equity Association and the Chorus  
Equity Association were triumphant  
because they gained recognition, the  
managers pointed with pride to the  
fact that provision for an "open shop"  
was included in the treaty of peace  
and the Actors' Fidelity League which  
supported the managers, proclaimed  
its satisfaction that it was also recog-  
nized.

The entertainments arranged by the  
Equity Association as part of their  
programme for raising funds for the  
strikers and otherwise demonstrating  
their independence of managers, will  
be continued for a short time, it was  
announced, because of leases. The  
leased theatres are outside the regu-  
lar theatre district and the programme  
will be changed in order that the stars  
may return to their original cast and  
do their starring in the usual  
places on Broadway and nearby.

**THE ARREST OF**  
**EMIR SAID WAS**  
**JUSTIFIABLE**

Field Marshal Allenby De-  
clares he is in Accord With  
the French on All Points in  
Syria.

Paris, Sept. 9.—Field Marshal P.  
Allenby, commander of the Allied  
forces in Asia Minor, talked on con-  
ditions in Syria in an interview given
