

STATE COUNCILLOR IN PARIS PREACHES RIGHT TO REVOLT

Leon Blum Intimates Opponents, if in Minority, Would Favor Force.

Paris, Dec. 1.—"We refuse to renounce our right to revolution," said Leon Blum, one of the Socialist leaders, in an interview with the Havas Agency today.

Blum is one of the few Socialist leaders to find a seat in the newly elected Chamber of Deputies. He is a high official in the conservative body called the Council of State, the origin of which goes back to the days of the Romans and which under the republic has taken the place of what was the King's Council.

Blum added that there need be no fear of Bolshevism, which now meant what radicalism meant in the elections of 1872, no more and no less, and served the same purpose, which was the defeat of the working classes.

"Within a few months," Blum continued, "we shall have a Bolshevik ambassador in Paris. None of us, even those who are called Bolsheviks, favors for one instant the adoption pure and simple in our country of the methods employed by Lenin and Trotsky in Russia, which were caused by particular circumstances, political, military, economic and moral, obtaining in Russia when the Bolshevik movement succeeded.


