ROADS ON DOMINION PROPERTY.

628. Without the consent of the Government of the Dominion of Canada, no municipal council shall pass a by-law,

1. For stopping up or altering the direction or alignment of any street, lane or thoroughfare made or laid out by His Majesty's Ordinance, or the Principal Secretary of State in whom the Ordinance states became vested under the Statute of the Province of Canada passed in the 19th year of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 45, or the Consolidated Statute of Canada, chapter 24, respecting the Ordinance and Admiralty lands, or by the Dominion of Canada; or

2. For opening any such communication through any lands held by the Dominion of Canada; or

3. Interfering with any bridge, wharf, dock, quay or other work vested in the Dominion of Canada; or

4. Interfering with any land reserved for military purposes, or with the integrity of the public defences, -

and a by-law for any of the purposes aforesaid shall be void unless it recites such consent. 3 Edw. VII, c. 19, s. 628.
