ARTICLE IX.—This Constitution may be altered at any regular meeting (by giving notice at the previous meeting of such intention)

by a majority of the members present. ARTICLE X .- The Society shall appoint at each annual meeting, the Audit Committee, to consist of three members, whose duty shall be to audit the Treasurer's accounts, previous to their being in the current year's transactions.

ARTICLE XI.—Any Parish in said County may hold a local Show subordinate to the central Society, on raising by voluntary subscriptions the sum of ten pounds; and will be entitled to a similar sum from the funds of the central Society, for said purpose.
