

## BAD BLAZE IN BUSINESS BLOCK

Fire At Corner of Dundas and Talbot Streets Follows Explosion.

Fire which broke out at 2:30 this morning in the premises at the northeast corner of Dundas and Talbot streets, known as the "Coo Building," caused thousands of dollars damage to the building and to the stock of tenants. The fire was a sudden burst of flame, following a crash somewhere in the interior of the building. The plant of the Roberts Engraving Company and the offices of the London Newspaper Subscribers are located in the building. William G. Cooles and his wife and baby, who were living in the top part of the building, were awakened by the flames and managed to make their escape before the fire cut off the stairways. The baby was carried out by Sgt. Tom Noonan.

Hockin Brook, grocer, estimated the loss at about \$5,000, which was caused by water. Some of the water even got into sealed bottles which were stored in the basement. Cooles and Henderson, barkeepers, and W. G. Fitzgerald, barkeeper, suffered only slight losses by water. The rest of the building, including the company and the Western Upholstering Company on the third floor were completely gutted by fire. The fourth and fifth floors of the building were the ones to which the fire was confined, it having started on the fourth floor. Forty minutes were required to get the blaze under control.

During the fire, Ross Roberts of the Roberts Engraving Company proved of great assistance to the firemen by putting into operation a 50,000 candle-power light. When it illuminated the scene of the second floor the firemen were able to work with greater facility.

The rooms of D. H. Porter, valuator; J. J. Allen, office supplies, and E. O. Graves, typewriter firm, were damaged by water. No loss was sustained by Mary Grant, London Township clerk, who had an office in the building. In the lavatory a bottle partially filled with whiskey was found. Tenants are wondering if anyone brought it into the building just previous to the outbreak of the fire and if it is in any way connected with the origin of the blaze.

L. C. Howell of Galt is the owner of the building.

## CHIPPAWA PLANT TO BE FINISHED BY SEPT.

Hydro System Is One of Ontario's Chief Assets, Says Beck.

Definite assurance that the Chippawa power project will be finished by September, within the estimated time, was given by Sir Adam Beck, chairman of the Hydro-Electric Power Commission, in an address to the Rotary Club today.

## TURKS AND REDS

Bolsheviki Are Rushing Down East Coast of Black Sea.

Constantinople, Feb. 28.—Hostilities between Russian Bolsheviki and Turkish forces for the possession of Batum is declared to be imminent in advance received here. Ten thousand Turkish soldiers, under Kasi Karabekir, commander of the fifteen army, are on the outskirts of Batum, and it is believed here that if the Bolsheviki should capture the city, Turkish occupation of Armenia would not be possible. The Bolsheviki are racing down the east coast of the Black Sea toward Batum, and are being followed by the French fleet at Sukhum, which, however, the Soviet forces captured last.

General Hecker, commander of the eleventh Bolsheviki army, which captured Tiflis, reports effecting a junction with Cossacks, who had advanced to that city across the Caucasus Mountains from Vladikavkaz.
