

The following Petitions were severally brought up, and laid on the Table:—

By the Honorable Mr. Clemow,—Of the Reverend John Grenfell, and others, of Granby.

By the Honorable Mr. Drummond,—Of the Montreal Board of Trade.

By the Honorable Mr. Sullivan,—Of Richard Whiting, President, and W. Timberlake, Secretary of the Kingston Branch of the Evangelical Alliance.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the following Petitions were severally read:—

Of W. G. Miller, and others, of Stellarton,—And of George H. Groves, M.D., and others, of the Township of Huntley; severally praying for the passing of the Bill: "An Act respecting Benevolent Societies;"—and

Of the Wood Mountain and Qu'Appelle Railway Company; praying for an Act to amend their Act of incorporation.

The Honorable Mr. Dickey, from the Committee on Railways, Telegraphs and Harbors, to whom was referred the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting the St. Lawrence and Atlantic Junction Railway Company," reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same to the House without any amendment.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. McMillan, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Clemow, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time presently.

The said Bill was then read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill without any amendment.

The Honorable Mr. Dickey, from the Committee on Railways, Telegraphs and Harbors, to whom was referred the Bill intituled: "An Act to revive and amend the Acts relating to the Saint Gabriel Levee and Railway Company," reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same to the House without any amendment.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. McMillan, seconded by the Honorable Mr. McInnes (New Westminster), it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time to-morrow.

The Honorable Mr. Dickey, from the Committee on Railways, Telegraphs and Harbors, to whom was referred the Bill intituled: "An Act to amend the Act to incorporate the Prescott County Railway Company, and to change the name of the Company to The Central Counties Railway Company," reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same with an amendment, which he was ready to submit whenever the House would be pleased to receive it.

Ordered, That the Report be now received, and

The said amendment was then read by the Clerk, as follows:—

Page 1, line 27.—Leave out from "Rockland" to "and" in line 28.

The said amendment being read a second time, and the question of concurrence put thereon, it was agreed to.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Clemow, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Armand, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill, as amended, be read a third time to-morrow.
