Two members from Les Ballets Jazz De Montreal who will be appearing in SUB Theatre next Friday and Saturday.

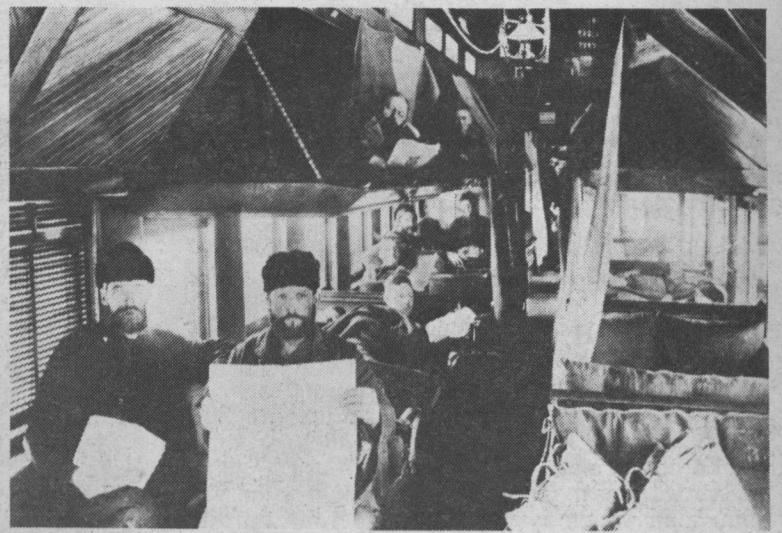
Enthusiasts of modern dance finding themselves lost in the winter doldrums should find some relief in Les Ballets Jazz De Montreal, who will perform in SUB Theatre on the evenings of February 22nd and 23rd.

Originally formed in 1972, the company has brought its unique blend of contemporary dance to audiences throughout North America, Europe, and the Carribean. Artistic Director Genevieve Salbraing has chosen to employ a number of choreographers in molding a repertoire which derives its cohesion from the juxtaposition of a variety of contemporary dance styles and the musical motifs of jazz.

The four pieces included in the Friday and Saturday evening programs draw their inspiration from Duke Ellington, Johnny Mercer, George M. Cohan and other well-known jazz composers.

During its 1979 tour the Company played to packed houses and rave reviews, both at home and abroad. Les Ballets Jazz De Montreal should satisfy even the most fanatic of Dance devotees.

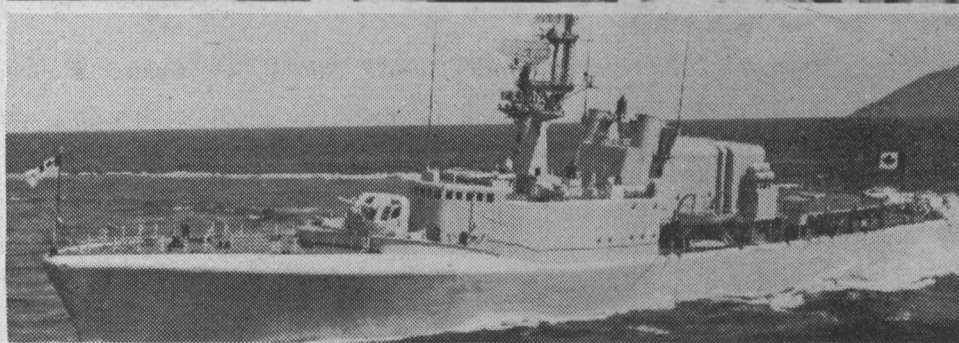
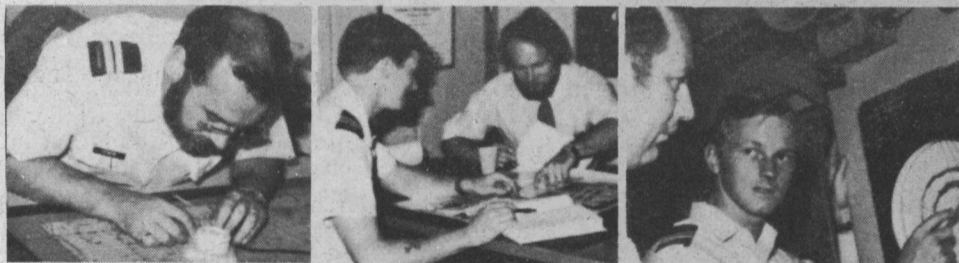
