# Tyke PCO's lead MTHL final

Mississauga rep PCO's, who finished runners-up in their regular western division combat, are only five points away from capturing the coveted Metro Toronto Hockey League tyke AA crown.

Coach Bob Herron's "Bug Squad" chomped its way through the first two starts of the all-MTHL final series with Don Valley in admirable fashion, tying the face-off game 1-1 then scoring a hard-fought 1-0 triumph in the ensuing stanza of the best-of-seven affair.

Sharp-shooter Randy Watling, the speedy winger who contributed a fair quota of key goals to the PCO's cause during the regular season and playoff campaign, emerged as the bonafide hero of the go-ahead victory when he collected a

loose puck and rushed through the entire Don Valley team to score the only goal.

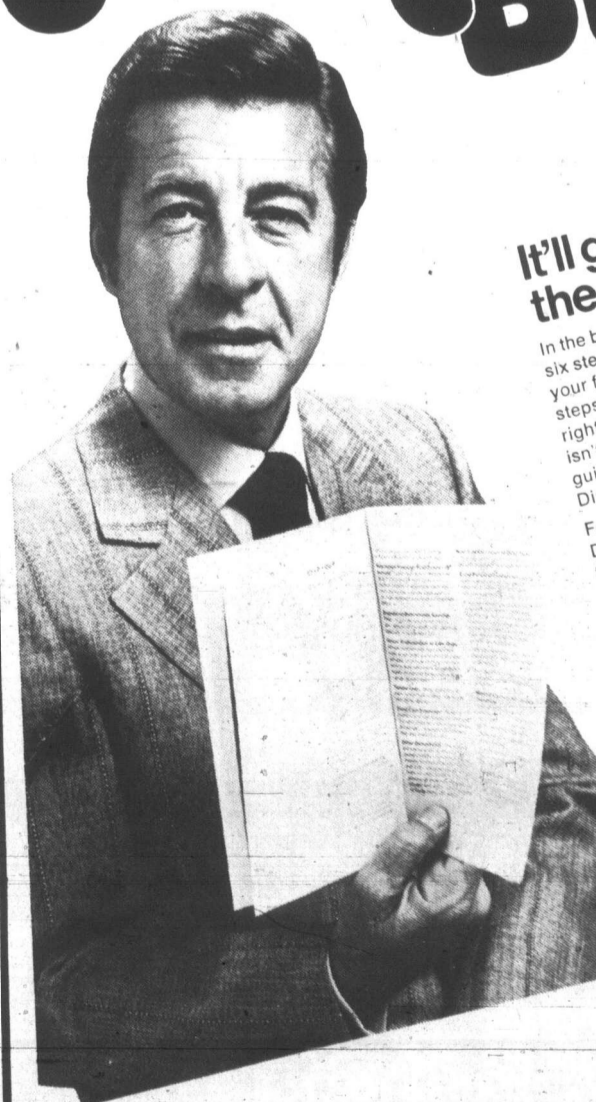

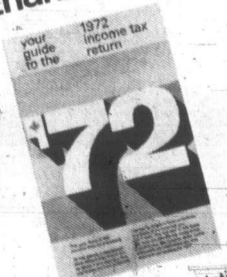

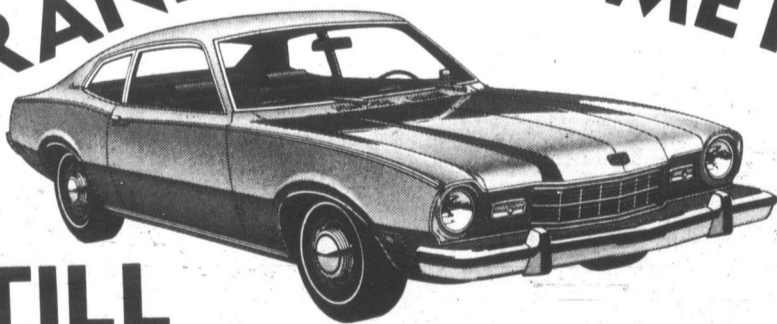
