Edmonton, Alta.	6 Sept./44	Wednesday	S/L A.E. Henderson (C2312) (Admin.) proceeded on temporary duty to R.C.A.F. Station, Rockcliffe, Ont., for a course preparatory to assuming new duties as Officer i/c of a department visiting flight which will circulate in No. 4 Training Command. S/L G. Milsom (C1976) (Admin.) reported by air from No. 15 S.F.T.S., Claresholm and assumed duties of T/Commanding Officer. The Armament final for Course 109 was held which all airmen successfully passed.	
	7 Sept./44	Thursday	The final examination in Meteorology was held this morning for students of Course 109 which one airman failed. In the afternoon the whole Station attended a lecture presented by Dr. Bryce on "China and the Far East". Dr. Bryce has spent 25 years as a United Church Missionary in that part of the world and the lecture was most instructive and interesting. The great rounds of applause both after the lecture and a short question period was very heart-warming. A "Props Parade" for graduates of Course 108 was held at 1615 hours, props being presented by the T/Commanding Officer, S/L G. Milsom (C1976) (Admin.). In order to emphasize to the trainees the importance of the aircrew leadership training which is being given on this Unit, a departure was made from normal procedure in this Parade in that the Cadet Officers of the week were in sole control of the Parade with no commissioned staff officer assisting whatsoever. The recently organized Corporal's Club held a social evening in the Normal School Gymnasium. The enthusiasm engendered by this Club makes the organization worthwhile even though it will be in existence for only approximately three months. The incidence of sickness on the Station continues at a very low level with only one patient from this Unit in the Station Hospital. Nine personnel from this Unit are in other hospitals.
