	9 Oct/45		Ceiling 2,000 ft., and visibility 10 miles at 0830 hrs. Flying washed in at 0900 hrs. and washed out at 1630 hrs. S/ L White and F/L MacDonald of No. 1 A.C. arrived at this unit today for the purpose of making an accounts inspection.	
	10 Oct/45		0830 hrs., ceiling 3,000 ft. and visibility 6 miles. Flying washed in 0900 hrs. and washed out at 1630 hrs. An informal dance for all ranks was held in the W.D. Lounge at 2100 hrs. Music was provided by the record player and coffee and doughnuts were provided by the Messing Officer, S/O Gordon.	
	11 Oct/45		0830 hrs., ceiling and visibility unlimited. Flying washed in at 0900 hrs. and washed out at 1630 hrs. Our Commanding Officer, W/C D.G. Mallyy, DFC, commanded a detachment of three flights of airmen which proceeded to Hamilton, Ont. for the purpose of attending a parade in honour of Major-General Grerar, General Officer Commanding the Canadian Army.
