Uplands, Ontario	11 June 1943		<p>Overcast - low clouds - to partly cloudy. Wings Parade - Course #75 at 1400 hours. Wings were presented by Air Vice Marshal McGill, Air Officer Commanding, #1 Training Command, Toronto. Group Captain A. Raymond, Commanding Officer, #2 S.F.T.S., Uplands, presented Navigator's badges to the following:-</p> <p>S/L G.E. Wilson F/L T.E. Duffie F/O E.W. Howard</p> <p>The swimming pool was officially opened for the summer season by Air Vice Marshal McGill. The Rockcliffe Band was in attendance and an enthusiastic crowd witnessed the water events arranged.</p> <p>An Officers' Mess dance was held and was well attended. A dance was also held for other ranks in the Recreation Hall and was a great success.</p>	
	12 June 1943		<p>Cloudy to overcast. J20560 Flying Officer R.J. Donohue with 2011 WOII Stuart, G.M. as student allowed engine of aircraft to ice up near Ogdensburg, New York. Pilot overshot on landing and aircraft struck ground and overturned. "B" category accident. No injuries sustained to either occupant.</p>	
	13 June 1943		<p>Overcast. Nil to report. Regular Divine Services were held in the morning.</p>	
	14 June 1943		<p>High overcast. S/L H.M. Wilson (C1405)(GL) assumed temporary command of #2 S.F.T.S. during the absence on one week's leave of G/C A. Raymond.</p>	
	15 June 1943		<p>Overcast. Rain in afternoon. The popular movie "In Which We Serve" from Noel Coward's book, was shown in the Recreation Hall.</p> <p>Uplands tied Rockcliffe in a soccer game at Rockcliffe 2-2.</p>
