My Lord,

I have the honour to submit the following report respecting Mr. Charles Favre, naturalized in Canada in 1910, of Swiss origin.

Mr. Favre was born at Goumouens-la-Ville (Canton de Vaud) on October 25th, 1877, of Swiss parents.

He went to Canada in 1907, settled there as a farmer, and was naturalized in 1910. His Naturalization Certificate is dated at the County Court of Yale at Greenwood (British Columbia) on November 16th, 1910.

In 1911 he returned to Switzerland and soon afterwards joined the Society "L'Ange de l'Eternel" (7, rue de la Tour Maitresse, Geneva) as an evangelist and has worked for them ever since. He has not visited Canada or any other British territory since 1911, nor does he seem to have maintained any connection with the British Empire.

Since he returned to Switzerland in 1911 he has always been regarded as a Swiss citizen and he now holds a Swiss pass-port.

I have no unfavourable information either as to his conduct during the war or as to his general attitude with regard to the British Empire.
