Mr. Meighen proceeded to show the increasing influence of Canada in the League of Nations, which enhanced its standing in the world, and increased its opportunities, not only for itself, but for humanity, and concluded:

"What Canada needs today more than anything, is courage. There is no cause for discouragement today. I am not one of those who paint everything rosy when it is not, but

whatever is not going well in Canada it is in the power of the Canadian people to correct. If there is any injustice, it is in our power to remove it. All we have to do is to show the same perseverance and courage as animated those great men who made our Dominion what it is today."

Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighen was given another burst of cheering at the conclusion of his address. He left again last evening for Ottawa, to resume his duties in Parliament.
