Dear Arthur:

I just have yours of 17th this morning. If I find any special reason, will wire you tonight, besides writing this letter.

Certainly anyone summoned before a Committee can have Counsel at his side, and I have not the least doubt you would be permitted to appear. I know the Eaton Company had a lawyer here with a watching brief. Am in hopes of seeing you. There is quite a little I can discuss with you then.

May say I have already spoken to Mr. Guthrie and in no casual way. Cannot say more than that he takes the ground that decisions as to B. C. are taken pretty much wholly on the recommendation of the Minister from there. As stated before, he is personally very friendly. I do not see why he should not carry his feelings farther on his own responsibility in a case like this.
