## MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRIME MINISTER:

We have received, from very secret and confidential United Kingdom sources, the following information which, I think, will be of interest to you.

Last week a conference in Berlin, attended by Japanese military attaches, indicated that,

- (a) Military operations of Japan in the far east and those of Germany in Europe remain unconnected and unco-ordinated.
- (b) Japan will shortly attack the U.S.S.R.
- (c) Japan has no Axis obligations in respect of U.S.S.R. questions.
- (d) The Japanese Government still remember Hitler's statement to the Japanese Ambassador in Berlin at the beginning of the Nazi-Soviet war, that Germany would herself defeat Russia and did not desire the participation of Japan in that war.
