



Reference M.L-C-4493 (A) dated 11 Mar 44:-

1. An inquiry has been made with regard to the question of remission of the balance of this soldier's sentence.
2. Reference to M.F.M. 268 reveals that neither this soldier's Commanding Officer nor the D.C.C., M.D. 4, recommended any remission at the commencement of the term of detention.
3. However, the report of the Commandant, Military Detention Barracks, dated 15 May 44, states that this soldier has earned 25 days out of a possible 25 days remission; that the soldier is fit; that the detention is not doing him any harm; that the moral effect is good; that he is a well trained soldier and likely to become a good soldier, but that suspension is not recommended at the present time. It is noted that if all remission is earned, his sentence will expire on 2 Aug 44.
4. This soldier was tried on 16 Dec 43 and has now served over five months of a nine months sentence.
5. The question has been raised that while under arrest and prior to sentence this soldier suffered a foot injury. May a report be forwarded on this point, please.
6. It is noted that Cdr. Carrier is a General Service soldier and that he is of Overseas age. If his category permits and he is at the proper stage of training, you may think it advisable to give consideration to remission or suspension of sentence.
7. It is entirely within your discretion, and it is not desired to interfere in any way.
