Buffalo radio- The closest direction finding station of the FCS is Canancaique, New York, that's about 95 miles from Buffalo.
Toronto ATC - That would be south of Buffalo is it, or southeast I suppose.
Buffalo radio- South of Rochester. The telephone number is Canancaique 74 but the trouble is we've never been able to get them. The phone rings and rings and rings but nobody ever answers but there supposed to be there.
Toronto ATC - I see. What's the number again, I didn't get the letters?
Buffalo radio- Canancaique 74.
Toronto ATC - What's Canancaique?
Buffalo radio- It's a little town.
Toronto ATC - Right. Thanks Buffalo. ND 0128.
Toronto ATC - Muskoka, Toronto.
Muskoka radio- Muskoka.
Toronto ATC - Have you been monitoring 3105?
Muskoka radio- Yes.
Toronto ATC - Did you get any signals on BZY, a Grumman?
Muskoka radio- No, I didn't hear anything. Should he be close in here?
Toronto ATC - Well we don't know, he's lost between Montreal and Toronto and we're trying to find where he is. There's no DF stations around there are there?
Muskoka radio- Not in the vicinity of Muskoka here.
Toronto ATC - No, well if you would turn up your 3105 and see if you could get a check on his signal strength if he calls again.
Muskoka radio- Yes. If he's fairly close in I should have got him.
Toronto ATC - Stirling is working him fairly well but he's working Toronto radio and Toronto radio can't read him legibly so it's pretty hard to say where he is. If you'll let us know if you get any call from him or read any message from him.
Muskoka radio- BZY.
Toronto ATC - Right, yes.
Muskoka radio- Alright, I will.
Toronto ATC - ND 0131.
Toronto ATC - Hello.
Ottawa radio - Ottawa radio here. Our monitoring station has been unable to pick up the signals from that aircraft.
Toronto ATC - I see. For the last ten minutes or so, nobody's heard him. He's asking for continuous range at Toronto and has got it and he's probably trying to work out his own problem right now. However, he may call again if he's unsuccessful.
Ottawa radio - Roger. I'll have the DF station standby then?
Toronto ATC - Yes, if you still would. He's liable to call at any time you see. We can't talk to him through Toronto because he's requested continuous range and he's on the Toronto range somewhere.
Ottawa radio - Roger.
Toronto ATC - ND 0133 Stirling release.
Ottawa radio - JB.
