The entry of Holland would make Great Britain a present of Java, the whole Island of Borneo, and among other conquests, Britain would add to the greater part of her African possessions, and also those in the Far East. Holland may as well surrender her ships and hold on desperately to her neutrality, painful though it may be. Whichever side she takes, she stands to lose."

Java, besides being a great coffee producer, is the fourth oil region in the world.
