labour and raw material, should be vested in the State, and should be developed on the most efficient scientific principle of mass production, under the guidance of an elected Socialist Government, having representative advisory Economic Councils, responsible for each branch of industry and cultivation, and representative Social Welfare Councils, responsible for the cultural and recreational need of the people, located at strategic points throughout the country.

The product of this collective industry would, naturally, belong to the State, (the representatives of the people, in the form of an elected Socialist Government) which would be responsible for the equitable disposition of the goods, and material created under the system.

It would be the duty of the State to provide an educational system which would teach the children of the country, every useful branch of the abstract, and physical arts, and sciences, calculated to develop a cultured people, and also to supply the young people, with the necessary technical training, to fit them for the scientific, industrial or agricultural pursuits, in which they would later find their social usefulness.

The principal business of the supreme government would be to ascertain the total requirements of the people, and, in consultation with the economic councils, to allot, on a quota basis, the quantities of commodities
